The Australasian Retreat for Advanced Volunteer Management is the brainchild of two leading volunteerism experts, Andy Fryar & Martin J Cowling.

In 2005 they recognised a need to provide training for those leaders of volunteers who were wanting to have a dialogue beyond the basics of volunteer management practices.

Along with invited international and national Faculty members, Martin and Andy have created an experience which is *not* a conference, but rather an opportunity for a strictly limited number of delegates to enter into peer dialogue and mutual problem solving on both a micro and macro scale.

Being held in 2010 in the wonderful Adelaide Hills, the Retreat has now become a much anticipated event with results from the experience stretching far beyond the confines of the few days delegates are together.



HISTORIC HAHNDORF

ARAVM 2010 will be held at the Hahndorf Resort, located in the historic German village of Hahndorf, nestled in the Adelaide Hills.

Settled in 1839 by Lutheran immigrants seeking freedom from religious persecution in Europe, Hahndorf today still retains many of its links with its German past.

The Hahndorf Resort is situated on 32 acres of gum studded hills and features spectacular views. The resort is only 25 minutes away from the Adelaide CBD and includes half court tennis and an outdoor pool.

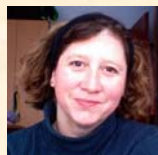

In 2004 he became the first Australian to be invited to join the faculty of the UK's 'Institute for Advanced Volunteer Management'

One Bedroom Executive Chalets - Serviced apartments in a secluded cul-de-sac overlooking the Resort's lake. Each of the chalets boasts a separate bedroom with a queen sized bed, lounge area and a two person spa **\$145 per night**

Two Bedroom Executive Chalets - Serviced apartments in a secluded cul-de-sac overlooking the Resort's lake. Each of the chalets boasts a separate bedroom with a queen sized bed and a second bedroom with twin beds. They have a lounge and two person spa. Twelve of the chalets provide a second bedroom with two single beds. All chalets have private facilities, tea and coffee making facilities, bar fridge, toasters, microwave, TVs and reverse cycle air conditioning **\$115 pp per night**

Bavarian Chalets - Traditional Bavarian Chalets set amongst pines and gum trees with standard motel facilities. All chalets have private facilities, tea and coffee making facilities, bar fridge, toasters, microwave, TVs and reverse cycle AC **\$105 pn**

Resort Rooms - Resort rooms are situated within the main building and with a queen sized or single bed. All have private facilities, tea and coffee making facilities, bar fridge, toasters, microwave, TVs and reverse cycle AC **\$95 pn**

There is accommodation for all at the Resort. As they are allocated on a first come first served basis, please be advised your choice may not be available

HOW TO BOOK

As with previous Retreats, the 2010 event will be limited to just 52 participants *who have a minimum two years of 'hands on' experience managing volunteer programs*. Delegates must agree to attend the Retreat in its entirety
